HURRICANE SEASON 2022 STILL PREDICTED TO BE ACTIVE DESPITE SLOW START

LAKE MARY, Fla. The 2022 Atlantic hurricane season is still predicted to be an active season, despite the slow start according to the mid-season forecast released Thursday by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and Colorado State University. This hurricane season has seen less activity than the past two seasons. Three of the main reasons are the sea-surface temperature, Saharan dust, and the La Nina pattern. There has been no major hurricane to form this season, just three tropical storms: Alex, Bonnie, and Colin, and even though this is less active than past seasons, it is on schedule for an average season. We are now moving closer to the peak of hurricane season, which is Sept. 10, and roughly 90% of tropical activity occurs after Aug. 1. Therefore, both

NOAA and Colorado State remain confident in their predictions."We're knocking down our forecast numbers a bit," Phil Klotzbach, lead author of the CSU forecast, told FOX Weather. "That's not necessarily due to the quiet period we've had lately, but more due to the large-scale circulation becoming slightly less favorable."

Due to La Niña, CSU is still expecting an above-average season with 18 named storms, eight of which could become hurricanes with winds of at least 74 mph. Experts say out of the hurricanes, four of them could be major (<u>Category 3 or higher</u>) with winds of at least 115 mph.
